Take a walk along tree-lined Lambie Street, through 150 years of Cooma history.

The Lord Raglan Inn is the oldest remaining building in Lambie Street. It was built in 1854 by the Hain family.

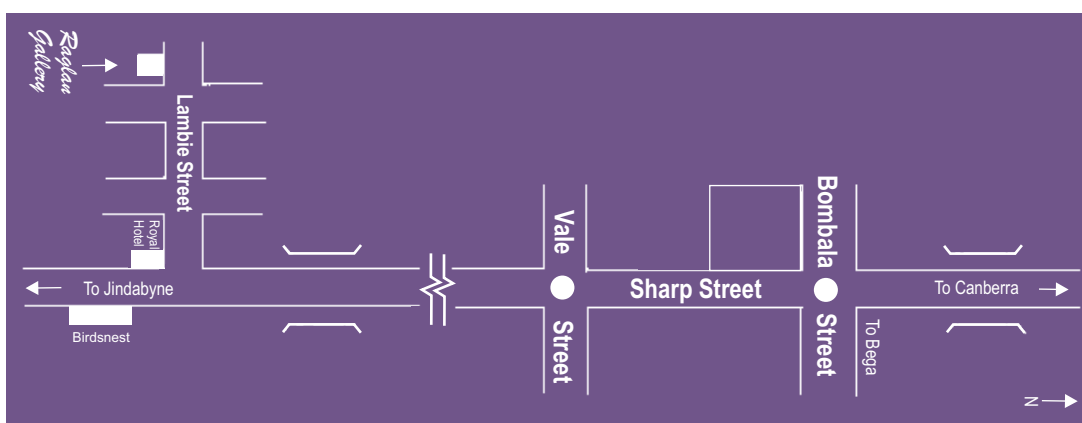
The Inn, now with a new gallery completed in 2014, has been home to the Raglan Gallery & Cultural Centre for over forty years.

Exhibitions change regularly throughout the year and fine artwork by members and local artists is on show and for sale at all times, as well as jewellery, cards, preserves, books and other gift items.

The building and its garden, which contains original plantings and trees, is a listed heritage site. It has served Cooma in many guises over the years, including as the first bank during the Kiandra gold rush and accommodation for workers on the Snowy Mountains Hydro-Electric scheme.
